# **Questions for Reflection:**

It all happened on Sunday. It was on "the first day of the week" (John 20:19) – the same day Jesus rose from the dead (John 20:1) – when the risen Lord appeared to a group of disciples in a locked house and offered them the gift of the Holy Spirit. Then, one week later (John 20:26), Jesus came again to the disciples (still shut inside the house), this time allowing Thomas to touch his hands and side. Think about the place where you gather for worship on Sunday. Is it open to the surprising presence of the Spirit? (If not, does the Spirit still move? Does Jesus show up anyway?) Are there times when your questions and doubts grow deeper? Are there times when your faith is strengthened and renewed?
