Accept our repentance, O God, for the wrongs we have done. For our neglect of human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty.

For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, **Have mercy on us, O God.**

For our waste and failure to care for your creation and our lack of concern for those who comes after us,

Have mercy on us, O God,

Restore us, O God of our salvation, and show us your steadfast love.

Turn to us in your mercy and redeem us. Amen.
