Lectionary Readings and Questions for Reflection

2 Kings 2:1-12; Psalm 50:1-6; 2 Corinthians 4:3-6; Mark 9:2-9

The Old Testament reading for today presents Elijah as a "new Moses"- striking the Jordan with his mantle and causing the waters to part so that he and Elisha could pass through on dry ground (2 Kgs. 2:8). The Gospel reading builds on this comparison by placing Moses and Elijah together at Jesus' transfiguration (Mark 9:4). There is also a parent-child dynamic in each of these passages. Elisha asks to receive a "double share" of Elijah's spirit (2 Kgs. 2:9) – the appointed inheritance of a firstborn son (see Deut. 21:17). At the transfiguration, God's voice from the cloud bestows on Jesus the mantle of divine authority: "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" What do these constellations of relationships suggest to you? How do the help you understand the transfiguration of Jesus? How is Jesus the fulfillment of the law (Moses) and the prophets (Elijah)?
